# **Healthy Communities Coordinator & Recreational Coordinator**

Pat Peterson sent in the following report concerning the future of Healthy Communities:

Healthy Communities Coordinator Sean Hanlon had his term extended until February. He had put a proposal together and gave it to Bruce Mines and Plummer Additional late fall with his recommendation to hire a recreational

Coordinator and that he would offer to work for his present salary and share his hours between both communities as Recreational Coordinator and Economic Development. This is an exceptional offer as someone with his training would be asking for a much more lucrative salary.

It was hoped that the two communities would be able to come to an agreement with the extension of his Healthy Communities term. The arena's future and discussion of staffing at the arena seems to have added some confusion. It has also been mentioned that some feel he does not volunteer enough hours to the community and really that should have nothing to do with it as this would be a paid position and the volunteering should be from the residents.

It will be shame if our area loses Sean and his capabilities as he has so much to offer our area.

The Chamber may not be able to do anything about this but should be aware of the situation.

It was noted that Sean Hanlon has volunteered a lot of his time with the Jr. Soccer Program, the Rec. All Nighter, the Teddy Bear Picnic just to name a few.

Howie Bowes strongly supports what Sean has done and acknowledges the need for a full time Recreational Coordinator. Volunteers are burning themselves out trying to organize events

when such duties could be taken on by the Recreational Coordinator and the volunteers assisting. – It is money that is the big block to renewing the Healthy Communities program for 2013.

Brian Torrance noted that there are 3 issues that are all related – Rec. Director, Economic Development, and the Arena which needs a Chamber Committee to head up and coordinate –

Motion: Larry Peterson + Howie Bowes that a Chamber form Committee to look into the development of a Recreational Director, Economic Development and the future of the Arena.-carried
