Affiliate membership is \$150.00 a year which gets the Chamber a listing on the brochure which is better than nothing to market the Bruce Mines Marina. It does get Bruce Mines a listing on their website and allows us to participate in the Shopping bags marketing program. However the Marina does not get listed in the brochure as a marina the Chamber is mentioned as an affiliate.
