Call to Order:

Michael Peever called the meeting to order at 8:00 a.m.

Past Minutes:

Motion: Larry Peterson + Jim McCulloch that the minutes of Tues. February 07, 2017 be adopted - **carried**

Treasurer Report:

Larry Peterson + Jim McCulloch that the Treasurer's Report be adopted as presented.

Canada 150:

Jim McCulloch reported that the bank account has been opened with signing authority being Jim McCulloch and Larry Peterson. Jim wants to set up proper accounting systems.

Motion: Jim McCulloch + Pat Peterson that the sum of \$1,500.00 be paid to the 150 Committee – **carried**

Jim reported that a rough budget has been drafted but there has been no report on the grant applications.

Jim McCulloch put in request for facilities – the matter will be discussed tomorrow Wed. March 8th at the Recreational Committee meeting

Town has booked the fireworks – the Townships Plummer & Johnson have agreed for in-kind donations but there is no financial commitments. The fireworks cost \$5,000.00 – the barge has been reserved.

Insurance:

Algoma Kinniwabi:

We usually share this membership with the Town and an email has been sent to them and they will reimburse the Chamber for their share if it is approved by Town Council. Tom Thomson - Group of 7:

Health & Safety:

Shannan Boston from the Algoma District Workplace Safety and Prevention Service will be presenting a high level introduction to the Health & Safety Regulations of Ontario. The course will include the following:

Introduction to Health & Safety in Ontario + Blended WHMIS

- Information on Health & Safety Regulations for businesses and organizations with volunteers.
- Health & Safety roles, regulations and resources.
- Some resources will be provided. Handouts on "new hire orientations, setting up Health & Safety in small businesses, what to post in your workplace
- information on Health & Safety policies
- General open question and answer period.
 - Introduction to the WSIB small business course to save 5% on last years WSIB. Date to be picked for the future for businesses that are interested in this course

AFTERNOON: Train the Trainer Blended WHMIS (2015) course giving out manuals that you can take back to your business to train your staff with. 2015 WHMIS is required for all employees by Dec 2018 or sooner if you purchase materials with the red diamond on them.

Barter in Bruce Mines:

Heidi Werner reported that she reached out to a small committee - Lenny Smith, Marla McPhee, Eve Webb, Mariners Cove – sold 5 tables inside the Hall – yard sale, trunk sale, artisan sale,

Selling a yard sale kit - \$10.00 registration fee – balloons, signs and put on the map. This is set for May 13, 2017

\$20.00 for inside table \$10.00 for outside space – bring your own table – registration paid in advance.

Marketing Committee: (Heidi Werner/Edith Orr/Cheryl McKay/Larry Peterson) Heidi Werner reported there was a brief meeting – need to work on a plan.

"Wow Wednesday" was raised to assist the Farmers Market. Edith Orr reported that there is a need to develop a Wednesday night entertainment to attract people to the waterfront.
